## Peace One Day

Peace One Day, a day of global ceasefire and non-violence is celebrated every year on September 21<sup>st</sup>. Special activities will take place all across the world; festivals, concerts, a global Peace Wave with moments of silence and prayer in every time zone, and much more. Since its inception, Peace Day has grown to include millions of people in all parts of the world.



## What is Peace One Day?

Jeremy Gilley is an actor turned filmmaker, who in the late 1990s became preoccupied with questions about the issue of peace. He decided to campaign to establish an annual day of ceasefire and non-violence.

In 1999, the United Nations unanimously adopted the first ever annual day of global ceasefire and non-violence on 21 September – Peace Day. The objective of Peace One Day is to institutionalize Peace Day 21 September, making it a day that is self-sustaining, an annual day of global unity, a day of intercultural cooperation on a scale that humanity has never known.

## Incredibly media interest in the UK is TOTALLY ABSENT!

Last year, the Peace One Day 2015 Report found that:

An estimated **1.5 billion people** were exposed to Peace Day messages.  
Of those aware, **13 million people behaved more peacefully** on that day.  
Close to **130 million people** were made aware of Peace Day through social media.  
Major campaigns included Google's homepage feature, and Coca-Cola's Peace Day Anthem ONE.


# GLoucestershire Historic Churches Trust

## Action for Refugees in Gloucestershire

Over the past year there has been a strong expression of interest from around the Diocese about how to help refugee families coming to England. Lots of people have been involved in practical tasks, such as painting houses for new arrivals or donating furniture. To date, eleven families have arrived in Gloucestershire. The government has recently launched a scheme that will enable a community to “sponsor” the welcome of a refugee family into their community. This scheme has been welcomed by Archbishop Justin Welby.

Churches, in partnership with their wider community are being encouraged to consider whether they can offer this support for a family. It is a significant commitment in both time and money (approximately £10k) which shouldn't be underestimated, but is a real possibility for any group that sees this as a significant expression of their Christian discipleship. The aim is to enable a good welcome and stable start for families coming to England until the state is able to provide long term security. It is also important to put in place appropriate, qualified support for these families, which is why GARAS (Gloucestershire Action for Refugees and Asylum Seekers) is strongly involved with this initiative.
